## **Project meeting and internal evaluation of the quality of educational programs at S. Kuznets KhNUE, January 2020**

January 28 - 30, 2020 S. Kuznets KhNUE held a project meeting of the EDUQAS project, dedicated to the internal evaluation of the quality of educational programs "Information Systems and Technologies" (specialty 126, master's level) and "Economics of Enterprise" (specialty 051, bachelor's degree).

For three days, the team of S. Kuznets KhNUE presented to partners from Belgium, France, Kazakhstan and Ukraine its internal quality assurance system, developed and implemented during the EDUQAS project, taking into account ESG standards and experience of their implementation by European universities.

During the meeting, project experts (including an expert from the French Agency HCRERS, France, Professor Gilles Jaco and Head of the Quality Assurance Center of the University of Liege, Belgium, Dominique Tevissen) reviewed the official documentation, facilities and resources of the university, studied in detail the QA department and QA system, administrative departments of the university and had the opportunity to communicate not only with the administration, teachers and students, but also with employers and graduates.

In addition, during the meeting, the members of the Erasmus + EDUQAS project met with the Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of France to Ukraine, Mr. Etienne de Poncins. The delegation also included Alix de Gassar, Attaché for Scientific and University Cooperation, Timothy de Mayer, Director of the Alliance Française Kharkiv, and Serhiy Polituchy, Honorary Consul of France in Kharkiv.

Also in the frame of the meeting S. Kuznets KhNUE rector signed a cooperation agreement with the Abilai Khan Kazakh University of International Relations and World Languages. This will provide opportunities for joint research and academic exchanges between researchers and students of both universities.





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
